Chairman Keefe called the meeting to order.

ITEMS OF DISCUSSION:

1. Security in County Courthouse

Mr. Nick Nickeson presented a security plan for the county courthouse. He recommended the installation of walk-thru metal detectors at doors entering the building, locks on some of the doors in the building, and hiring of security officers. He also suggested a photo-badge system be initiated for all employees in the building as well as for all county employees.

2. Social Services Carpet Replacement

Mr. Bob Stanger, County Engineer, said he had received bids to replace the carpet on the second floor of the social services building. The low bid was higher than what was budgeted and it was also higher than what the county could accept thru an informal bid method. Mr. Stanger noted he would have to put the item out for bid again.

The Committee discussed putting additional money in a building that is sub-standard. The Committee also discussed the make-up of the flooring in the social services building noting there are actually four layers of coverings. (carpet, plywood, leveling compound, and tile.

3. Capital projects

The Committee turned in their priority list to Mr. Keefe who indicated he would review and inform the members of the committee's priority list based on their choices.
