One-Stop Voting Starts April 15

FAYETTEVILLE – The Board of Elections reminds citizens that One-Stop Voting for the May 4 partisan primary starts April 15 at the Board of Elections office on East Russell Street and on April 19 at four other sites -- Cliffdale Recreation Center, North Regional Branch Library, Hope Mills Recreation Center and Spring Lake Branch Library. Early voting ends at 1 p.m. on May 1. Hours are posted on the county's web site and listed below.

Registered voters have until April 9 to update or change their information. New voters may register during the One-Stop period. To register, you must present an acceptable form of ID. Acceptable forms are: N.C. driver's license with current address; utility bill with voter's name and current address; document from a local, state, or U.S. government agency; passport; government-issued photo ID; U.S. military ID; license to hunt, fish, own a gun, etc.; property or tax bill; automotive registration; certified documentation of naturalization; a check, invoice or letter from a government agency; student ID, along with a document from the school showing student's name and current address; a paycheck or paycheck stub from an employer or a W-2; and a bank statement or bank-issued credit card statement.

If you would like to request an absentee ballot, you must write a letter with your name, Cumberland County physical address, address where you want the ballot mailed, date of birth, signature, phone number and/or e-mail where you can be reached. The last day to request absentee ballots by mail is April 27. Mail your request to 301 E. Russell Street, Fayetteville, NC 28301.

This is a partisan primary, and you must vote in the party primary you are registered. If you are registered as unaffiliated, you may vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. You also have the option of choosing the Non Partisan ballot. If you are registered as a Libertarian, you are eligible to vote the Non Partisan ballot. If you are not sure of the party you are registered, contact the Board of Elections Office.
