STORM UPDATE

Three FEMA Town Hall Meetings Scheduled; Landfill Returns to Normal Hours

Fayetteville, NC – Federal Emergency Management Agency and state Emergency Management officials will hold three town hall meetings in storm-affected areas of Cumberland County to distribute information and answer questions from the public regarding disaster assistance.

Representatives from local emergency management, the Small Business Administration, and non-profit organizations have been invited.

The meetings are scheduled for 7 p.m. on:

- May 17 at the Beaver Dam Fire Department, 11042 NC Highway 210 South
- May 18 at the College Lakes Recreation Center, 4945 Rosehill Road
- May 24 at the Westover Recreation Center, 277 Bonanza Drive

Landfill Resumes Normal Hours

After extending hours to assist storm debris cleanup, the Ann Street Landfill will return to its normal operating schedule Monday, May 16. Hours will be 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Residents are reminded that after Friday, May 13, regular fees will apply at the Wilkes Road Treatment and Processing Facility for vegetative debris. The county had waived fees for storm-related vegetative debris after the April 16 tornadoes.
