County Hires New Assistant County Manager

FAYETTEVILLE – County Manager James Martin has hired Quentin T. McPhatter as the county’s new assistant county manager for auxiliary services. McPhatter has been the deputy city manager of Kingsland, Ga., since July 2007 and has served as interim city manager there since June.

McPhatter begins his job with the county on Jan. 13. He will oversee the following departments: Animal Control; Central Maintenance; Emergency Services/Fire Marshal; Engineering and Infrastructure (Building Maintenance, Court Facilities, Carpentry, Electrical and Mechanical, Public Utilities); Grounds Maintenance/Landscaping; Planning and Inspections; Print and Graphic Services, and Solid Waste Management.

A Scotland County native, McPhatter was the town manager of Green Level, N.C., from 2003-2007. He also worked for the Town of Knightdale as a planner and as a planning assistant for the City of Raleigh.

McPhatter, 39, earned a bachelor’s degree from Wake Forest University and a master’s degree in public administration, with cum laude distinction, from North Carolina Central University. He was named a credentialed manager by the International City/County Management Association in 2010 and serves on that association’s advisory board for graduate education.

“Mr. McPhatter’s experience over the last decade as a city and assistant city manager will be an asset as he moves into his new role in Cumberland County. We look forward to welcoming him to our management team,” Martin said.

McPhatter’s annual salary will be \$123,091.
