### **Wright Brothers Show Comes to Cumberland County Public Library & Information Center**

2003 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of powered flight by Orville and Wilbur Wright.

Throughout the year communities all over the state will commemorate this historic event with festivities and events of all kind. The Museum of the Cape Fear Historical Complex and the Cumberland County Public Library & Information Center will co-sponsor *Right Place, Right Time, Wright Brothers*, on March 30 at 2:30 pm in the Pate Room of Headquarters Library.

*Right Place, Right Time, Wright Brothers* is a story of vision, productivity and achievement as it recognizes and celebrates how the world became smaller in only twelve seconds. Written by Ellis Woodward and Debi Wynn, the performance lasts one hour and includes seventeen musical numbers, audience participation, and is educational as well as entertaining. The story is guided through the remembrances of Wilbur and Orville's sister Katherine as they try to resolve all the problems that accompany their endeavor. The performance brings the audience in time through the accomplishments of flight with the song, "One Small Step" and anchors all those achievements solidly to the vision and courage of the Wright Brothers, who were absolutely in the right place at the right time.
