City-County Joint Appearance Commission Seeks Nominations for Appearance Awards

(Fayetteville, N.C.) – The City-County Joint Appearance Commission is now seeking nominations of properties in Cumberland County which enhance the appearance of the community. Properties located anywhere in Cumberland County can be nominated.

Properties can be nominated through June 15 in the following 11 categories:

- Category 1 - Best New Residential Property
- Category 2 - Best New Non-Residential Property
- Category 3 - Best Revitalization of a Residential Property
- Category 4 - Best Revitalization of a Non-Residential Property
- Category 5 - Best Housing Development or Neighborhood
- Category 6 - Best Landscaping Project
- Category 7 - Best Green Project
- Category 8 - Best Restoration of a Historical Property
- Category 9 - Best Existing Residential Property
- Category 10 - Best Existing Non-Residential Property
- Category 11 - Best Neighborhood Entrance/Gateway

The Joint Appearance Commission will recognize properties at an awards ceremony this summer.

To nominate properties, the Joint Appearance Commission requests that the public fill out and provide information shown in their nomination form. The nomination form is contained within a brochure about the program. The nomination form/brochure can be obtained by calling the City of Fayetteville Planning and Zoning Division at 433-1612 and requesting that the brochure/form be mailed. Another way to obtain the nomination form/brochure is to log onto www.cityoffayetteville.org/appearanceaward/ and print the form/brochure from the website.

The easiest way to nominate a property is to fill out the online form posted on the website at www.cityoffayetteville.org/appearanceaward/. Persons can also follow submittal instructions, listed in the brochure, for mail or email.

If you are submitting the nomination form by using the website, please follow the instructions on the website for attaching photos.

At least three photos of the property are required, but a maximum of five photos may be submitted. Photos must be from different angles and must be in .jpg, .tif or .bmp format. Printed images will not be returned.

Nominations must be postmarked, emailed or submitted online by June 15.
